JASPAL SINGH, J.

Instant petition has been preferred under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 seeking quashing of FIR No. 62, dated 29.11.2014 (Annexure P-1) under Sections 447, 294, 511, 506, 120-B, 148 and 149 IPC, Police Station Kabirpur (Akhlikalan), District Kapurthala along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 11.02.2016 (Annexure P-2).

2. In compliance of order dated April 11, 2016, report of

learned Judicial Magistrate has been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that both the parties have effected compromise which is genuine, voluntary, without any threat, pressure, coercion or undue influence and deponents have no grudge or revenge with each other and they want to live peacefully to avoid untoward incident in the future. Even otherwise, the matter involved is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

3. So, in view of above circumstances, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for their benefit and will bring peace and harmony between them.

Consequently, the instant petition stands allowed and FIR No. 62, dated 29.11.2014 (Annexure P-1) under Sections 447, 294, 511, 506, 120-B, 148 and 149 IPC, Police Station Kabirpur (Akhlikalan), District Kapurthala and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom are quashed qua the petitioners.
