The petitioner remained on interim bail for a period of about six months during the period the report of Forensic Science Laboratory was awaited.

Counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner has been in custody for a period of about one year. No witness of the prosecution has been examined.

The quantity of recovered salt being commercial, no ground is made out to grant the concession of regular bail in view of the provisions of Section 37 of N.D.P.S. Act.

The petition is dismissed. However, taking into consideration the status of the trial, it is ordered that in case the prosecution agency is not able to produce all the witnesses within a period of four months after the next date of hearing, trial Court shall release the petitioner on bail on his furnishing bail and surety bonds to its satisfaction.
