The petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 28 dated 14.02.2016 registered at Police Station Shimlapur, District Ludhiana under Sections 304-B/34 IPC.

Both the petitioners are unmarried sister-in-laws. The deceased was married in October 2013. The unfortunate incident took place in February 2016.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the deceased was a law graduate and it was inter-caste marriage and the deceased was teaching and she had left a suicide note wherein no allegations of demand of dowry or under the SC/ST Act have been levelled and general allegations have been made that she was unable to bear the torture daily and was, therefore, taking the step. He further states that the girl had come to the matrimonial home to celebrate her son's first birthday and in the suicide

note she had given clean chit to the husband. He further states that the husband and mother-in-law are in custody.

The petitioners have joined the investigation, the petition is allowed and interim order dated 17.03.2016 is hereby made absolute subject to the condition that the petitioners will join the investigation as and when required by the police and will not tamper with evidence or hamper the investigation and will not leave India without permission of the Court and will comply with the conditions contained in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
