There is delay of 225 days in filing the present revision petition.

For the reasons mentioned in the application, delay of 225 days in filing the present revision petition is condoned subject to all just exception.

Application stands disposed of.

Main Case

The present revision petition is directed against the judgment dated 19.05.2015 passed by learned Addl. Sessions Judge, Rohtak, affirming the judgment of conviction dated 13.08.2014 and order of sentence dated 19.08.2014 passed by Principal Magistrate, Juvenile Justice Board, Rohtak, whereby the petitioner being a juvenile offender was held guilty for the commission of offences punishable under Section 377 IPC and under Section 6 Protection of Children from Sexual Offences, Act, 2012 and was ordered to be sent to Special Home for a period of two years.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and have also carefully gone through the case file.

A perusal of judgments of both the Courts shows that the victim had supported the prosecution case. He had stated that a wrong act was done, which indicates the sexual abuse. His statement is also supported by the medical evidence to show that he was sexually assaulted. Both the parties are stated to be neighbours.

There is no reason for a seven years old minor to level such false allegations against the present petitioner. The judgments of both the courts below are well reasoned. There is no ground to interfere in the same.

Accordingly, the present revision petition stands dismissed.
