This revision has been filed against the concurrent conviction of the petitioner for the commission of offences under Sections 279 and 304-A IPC in FIR No.220 dated 05.11.2009 registered at Police Station Sadar Sunam.

The sentence awarded to the petitioner is as under:-

Under Section 279 IPC	:	To undergo rigorous imprisonment for six months.
Under Section 304-A IPC	:	To undergo rigorous imprisonment for two years and to pay fine of Rs.1000/-. In default of payment of fine to further undergo rigorous imprisonment for two months.

Both the sentences shall run concurrently.

Custody certificate by way of affidavit of Hardeep Singh, PPS Superintendent, District Jail Sangrur on behalf of State has been filed and the same is taken on record. Copy supplied to the counsel opposite. As per the custody certificate the petitioner has undergone actual sentence of 08 months and 18 days out of the total sentence of two years upto 19.08.2016.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that he does not dispute this revision on merits but prays that some leniency be shown in the sentence since the petitioner has learnt his lesson and any long incarceration may not have any reformatory effect but may ultimately harden the petitioner. He has further relied upon the judgment of the Supreme Court in the case of *State of Punjab Vs. Saurabh Bakshi, reported as 2015(2)RCR(Crl.) 495*.

In my considered opinion, these factors would justify a reduction in the sentence. Consequently, the revision against the conviction is dismissed but the sentence of the petitioner is reduced to that he has already undergone.

Revision petition stands disposed of.

Since the main case has been decided, the Criminal Misc.
Application, if any, also stands disposed of.
