Through the instant revision petition, the petitioner has laid challenge to the order dated 21.11.2014 passed by the learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Malerkotla, granting ₹1,000/- as interim maintenance to respondent No.2-wife and order dated 13.10.2015 passed by learned Additional Sessions Judge, Sangrur, enhancing the amount of maintenance to ₹4,000/- per month i.e. ₹1,000/- each for respondent No.2 and her three minor children.

Feeling aggrieved, the petitioner has preferred the instant revision petition.

During the pendency of the revision petition, the matter was referred to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court and the

parties were directed to appear there. Before the Mediation and

Conciliation Centre, the parties agreed to compromise the matter. A compromise in writing dated 12.07.2016 was effected between the parties without any undue pressure from any side and the same was placed on the record as Annexure 'A'. It is a matrimonial dispute between husband and wife and as good sense has prevailed, both the parties have decided to live together with their children peacefully without any ill-will against each other. As per compromise, the parties have settled their all disputes amicably and undertake to abide by all terms & conditions of the compromise. The parties shall be bound by their respective statements made in the compromise.

Accordingly, the revision petition is disposed of in terms of the compromise dated 12.07.2016 arrived at between the parties.
