The instant petition has been preferred challenging the judgment of conviction and order of sentence dated 30.11.2015, whereby the judgment of conviction and order of sentence dated 03/04.12.2013 passed by learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Fardiabad, convicting and sentencing the appellant-petitioner to undergo rigorous imprisonment for a period of one year and payment of compensation amount to the tune of ₹3,00,000/-, has been affirmed/upheld.

During the pendency of the instant revision petition, the parties have arrived at an amicable settlement which also stands reduced into writing in the shape of compromise Annexure P-1. Mr.

Sanjay Jain-complainant/respondent is present in Court along with his counsel Mr. B. S. Tewatia, Advocate and has admitted the compromise Annexure P-1. He also admits his signatures appearing on the compromise Annexure P-1. According to contents of compromise Annexure P-1, the matter has been finally settled and he has received the amount in respect of the cheque in question. He has no objection in case the instant revision is allowed.

In view of amicable settlement arrived at between the parties, as well as compromise Annexure P-1, instant revision is allowed, whereby conviction and sentence awarded to the petitioner by the learned Magistrate and affirmed/upheld by Appellate Court, is set aside. Consequently, the petitioner stands acquitted of the charges.
