JASPAL SINGH, J

At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner Ms. Prabhjot Kaur submits that she be allowed to withdraw the power of attorney filed by her on behalf of the petitioner, as she has no instructions.

Heard.

Her request is considered and allowed.

A complaint received in the office of Chief Justice's Secretariat, has been treated as criminal writ petition.

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Taking into consideration the allegations levelled, notice of motion was issued by this Court on August 26, 2015 and in compliance thereof reply/status report by way of affidavit of Vibhor Kumar, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police (City), Ferozepur has been filed.

The respondent-State has strongly refuted the allegations contained in the complaint by alleging that Paramjit Singh husband of the petitioner was never kidnapped or abducted by the police. Neither any attempt on August 20, 2015 for taking custody of Paramjit Singh husband of the petitioner, his brother Pargat Singh and one Sher Singh from outside the Court as alleged, was made by the police, nor any occurrence qua alleged abduction of Samandeep Singh minor son of petitioner has been found to be substantiated. The status report further transpires that Paramjit Singh, husband of the petitioner is having a criminal background. As many as four FIRs have been registered against him for the commission of various offences not only under the Indian Penal Code but also under the provisions of Arms Act as well as Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, the details of which have been unfolded in the para No.2 of the affidavit.

The complaint appears to have been moved by the petitioner just to evade or avoid the arrest of Paramjit Singh @ Pamma in the various cases registered against him as well as his relatives.

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However, the answering respondent has assured that if any legal action is sought to be taken qua the petitioner's husband/relatives, that will be taken in accordance with law.

Finding no merit with instant petition, the same stands dismissed.
