As per office report, the petitioner has deposited Rs.13,500/-, vide receipt No.152 dated 11.03.2016, in compliance of order dated 10.03.2016, passed by this Court.

In view of the compromise effected between the parties and in view of the fact that offence punishable under Section 138 of Negotiable Instruments Act, is compoundable, therefore, the judgment of conviction and order of sentence dated 13.03.2015 passed by learned JMIC, Jalandhar and judgment dated 04.02.2016 passed by learned learned Addl. Sessions Judge, Jalandhar, are set aside in view of the lawful composition of the offence.

Petitioner/accused Sonu Lal is acquitted accordingly and he be set at liberty forthwith, if his custody is not required in connection with any other case.
