On the basis of complaint addressed to Hon'ble the Chief Justice of this Court, the present case was treated as a Criminal Writ Petition (Habeas Corpus) and was ordered to be listed on judicial side.

On notice of motion having been issued, learned State counsel has filed the status report, which is taken on record.

As per the status report, an FIR No.296 dated 27.11.2015 under Section 22 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 was registered at Police Station Sadar Ferozepur against accused Gurmail

Singh, who is son of petitioner Tara Singh. It is on account of the aforesaid FIR, the police party had been patrolling the area. During this patrolling, the police saw one person coming by foot and when said person was asked to stop, he disclosed his name as Gurmail Singh son of Tara Singh, resident of village Bhamma Singh Wala, Dakhli Palla Megha, Police Station, Sadar Ferozepur, District Ferozepur.

In view of the above status report submitted on behalf of the respondent-State, it is established that a case is pending against Gurmail Singh son of the petitioner. As such, no action is required to be taken in the present petition and the same is, accordingly, dismissed.
