Instant petition has been preferred under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking issuance of directions to the respondents to grant all remissions earned by the petitioner including (i) ordinary in nature of quarter and AGCR and (ii) special in the nature of (a) Govt. Remissions, (b) DGPR and (c) Superintendent Remissions and others as per the Punjab Jail Manual (which have been wrongly, illegally withheld) as per remissions system under provisions of shortening of sentences, count the same towards sentence undergone by him and determine his release from jail without further delay as the petitioner already undergone and completed his entire sentence awarded by the court or to issue any other appropriate order or direction.

2. Notice of motion to the respondents.
3. At the asking of Court, Mr. D.R. Singla, DAG, Haryana accepts

notice on behalf of respondent-State of Haryana. Copy of the petition be supplied to learned State counsel during the course of day.

4. At the very outset of the arguments, it has been submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that though an application dated December 26, 2014 (Annexure P-2) was moved to the Chief Secretary, Haryana, Chandigarh seeking grant of remissions in sentence and for UTP/DAP but till date no action has been taken on the said application. However, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he feels satisfied, in case, direction is issued to the respondents to deal with and dispose of the application, by passing an appropriate order.

5. The present petition is disposed of with the direction to respondents No. 1 and 2 to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in his application dated 26.12.2014 (Annexure P-2) and to take appropriate decision in the matter within a period of one month from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
