The instant Criminal Writ Petition was registered on the basis of complaint submitted by Prabhjot Kaur, a law student of Panjab University, Chandigarh, residing at Village Bhundian, P.O. Behram Sarista, Distt. Jalandhar.

As per the complaint, complainant/petitioner, namely, Prabhjot Kaur, has alleged that one of her relative was illegally arrested by the police personnel of Bhogpur Police Station and was released after one and half hour. Besides this, she also alleged that a male and female member of her family are still in police custody.

Learned counsel for the State has filed status report on behalf of respondent-State of Punjab, by way of affidavit of Tejbir Singh, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub Division Adampur Distt. Jalandhar (Rural). The same is taken on record.

As per the reply, case FIR No.5 was registered on 18.01.2016 under Sections 354-B, 353, 186, 323, 341 and 34 IPC on

the basis of complaint given by Senior Executive Engineer, Punjab State Power Corporation Limited, Bhogpur against Rajeev Saini, his wife Sukhwinder Kaur and Jasdeep Singh with the allegation that they came to their office on *vehicle No.PB-08-BT-8222* and gave beatings to their office employee Smt. Narinder Kaur Saini and dragged her out side the office room from her chair. Reply further suggests that complainant/petitioner-Prabhjot Kaur is a niece of Rajeev Saini and his wife Sukhwinder Kaur. Furthermore, neither she is required or wanted in this case nor she was harrassed or her house was raided by the police and the complainant-petitioner has filed the present complaint without any reasonable and sufficient cause.

In view of reply filed by the State as well as the fact that complainant-petitioner was neither harrassed by the police, nor her house has ever been raided, no further orders are required to be passed in the instant petition and the same is hereby dismissed.
