The application, sent by Karnail Singh, to the office of Hon'ble the Chief Justice, is treated as criminal writ petition and is taken up on judicial side.

In the instant application, it is stated that on 18.01.2016 at about 8:00 a.m., when the son of the applicant was present at Shagun Ceremony of marriage at their neighbour's home, about 3-4 policemen came there and took him away alongwith his vehicle with them forcibly. It is further stated in the application that he has no knowledge as to whether they were police employees or not.

Notice of motion was issued. Learned State counsel appeared and he was directed to file status report.

Today, Status report, by way of affidavit of Satnam Singh, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of police (Rural), Ferozepur, on behalf of respondent(s)-State has been filed. Same is taken on record.

As per the said report, one Partap Singh alias Titu, son of Joginder Singh, who is accused in case FIR No.04 dated 09.01.2016, registered at Police Station Mamdot, under Section 21 of the Narcotic

Drugs & Psychotropic Substances Act,, 1985, during his interrogation, disclosed that Gurmej Singh, son of the petitioner, is having land beyond Indo Pak Border fencing and he used to bring heroin on his tractor and he is associated in this regard with one Raj Singh alias Raju, from whom, he (accused Partap Singh) had obtained heroin. It is also stated in the report that Gurmej Singh, son of the petitioner, was apprehended and arrested in case FIR No.09 dated 18.01.2016, registered at Police Station Mamdot, under Section 21 of the Narcotic Drugs & Psychotropic Substances Act and on 19.01.2016, he was produced before the Court of learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Ferozepur and then after remand of two days, he was sent to judicial custody on 21.01.2016.

In view of the said status report, no further action requires in the instant petition.

Accordingly, the instant petition stands disposed of.
