Instant writ petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing respondent Nos.1 to 3 to take necessary action by removing/demolishing the alleged illegal construction of 14 shops in the residential house bearing No.B-16-396/494, Milerganj, Ahluwalia Street, Ludhiana, made by respondent Nos.4 and 5.

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Learned counsel for respondent Nos.2 and 3 states that respondent Nos.2 and 3 are proceeding to take action against the defaulter i.e. respondent No.4 in accordance with law. Learned counsel ensures that after affording adequate opportunity of hearing to the effected parties, appropriate order will be passed as early as possible preferably within two months from today and the order so passed shall be communicated to the petitioner.

In view of statement of learned counsel for respondent Nos.2 and 3, learned counsel for the petitioner wants to withdraw the instant petition.
