Mahesh Grover, J.

This is a petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking directions for temporary release of the petitioner for a period of four weeks in order to enable him to meet his ailing mother.

There is no representation on behalf of the petitioner. Even on the previous two hearings, nobody has come present on behalf of the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the respondents has filed reply today in the Court and the same is taken on record. It indicates that parole has been declined to the petitioner on the ground that on verification it was found that the petitioner is undergoing imprisonment in the case registered vide FIR

No. 59 dated 20.5.2012, under Section 21 of the Narcotic Drugs &

Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 at Police Station Navi Baradari, Jalandhar. The petitioner being police official was involved in drug (Heroin) paddling. His release was, thus, found to be A danger to the security of State and public peace.

In view of the fact that his parole has been rejected by an order, we deem it appropriate to dismissed the present petition but with liberty to the petitioner to impugned the order (Annexure R1).
