This is a complaint received in the office of Hon'ble Acting Chief Justice's Secretariat, lodged by Dimple Kaushal, which has been ordered to be taken up on judicial side and to be treated as criminal writ petition (habeas corpus).

The complaint contains the allegations that his brother namely Amarjit Singh has been arrested by the police officials of Police Post Vishkarma Chowk, Ludhiana since 10 a.m. on February 22, 2016 without supplying any information to him or his other family members and further that police has refused to release him.

In response to notice of motion issued to State, reply by way of affidavit of Satish Kumar Malhotra, PPS, Assistant Commissioner of Police (Central), Ludhaina has been filed on behalf of respondent-State of Punjab.

As per the contents of the reply, in fact, one Gurpreet Singh s/o Narinder Singh had moved an application dated February 22, 2016 against brother-in-law of the petitioner namely Amar Singh with the allegations that he hurled abuses to him (Gurpreet Singh) who apprehends danger at his hands. Accordingly, Amar Singh as well as Gurpreet Singh were proceeded against under Section 107 & 151 Cr.P.C. on the same day i.e. February 22, 2016 vide DDR No.4. Information in this regard was also supplied to brother-in-law of the petitioner through wife of the accused namely Simple Kaur. Arrest memo was also prepared and subsequently he was produced before learned Executive Magistrate, Ludhiana, where he was discharged by the learned Magistrate. The instant complaint appears to have been filed under some wrong information or out of frustration.

In view of the facts referred above, the instant petition requires no further action, as such, the same stands disposed of accordingly.
