Prayer made in the petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India read with Section 3 (2-A) of the Punjab Good Conduct Prisoners (Temporary Release) Act, 1988 is for extension of parole as the petitioner wants to construct his house which had fallen and his family is without any shelter.

The petitioner was released on parole for four weeks in terms of warrant dated 23.2.2016 (Annexure P-1) and required to surrender before the jail authorities on completion of the said period on 23.3.2016.

According to the petitioner, his house has already fallen and, thus, there is no shelter for his family. He wants to construct his house. In fact, the construction has already started. Attention of the Court in this regard has been drawn to the photographs appended as Annexure P-2 with the petition.

On query put by the Court, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has not submitted any request to the jail authorities for extension of parole.

The petition is disposed of with the observation that in case the petitioner applies to the jail authorities for extension of parole, the same shall be considered and disposed of expeditiously, preferably, within a period of three days from the date of receipt of a certified copy of the order but in accordance with law.
