RAJIV NARAIN RAINA, J.(Oral)

1. The main relief prayed for has been granted pending present proceedings vide order dated December 10, 2015 passed by the respondent department. The petitioner has been granted deemed date of promotion with effect from August 20, 1993 as Accountant Grade II i.e. from the date when his junior was promoted by ignoring his claim. A copy of the order dated December 10, 2015 is retained on record. It is only the consequential benefits which remain to be paid as would follow from the said office order. These are yet to be disbursed for which it not felt necessary to keep the matter pending as nothing remains to be adjudicated.

2. In view of the above, this petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to compute the consequential benefits, if

admissible as per rules and if any further resultants are due percolation they may also be accorded by following such procedure as is laid down in the rules or instructions.

3. Insofar as the undetermined consequential benefits are concerned, those remaining be addressed and dealt with by passing a fresh order which may be made preferably within three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order. If hearing is found necessary for any clarification required the petitioner may be called to explain his case before the officer concerned. If any friction still remains unresolved or is unreasonably resolved the petitioner would be at liberty to approach Court once again.

4. Accordingly, this petition stands disposed of.
