Feeling aggrieved against the alleged undue delay in disposal of his applications (Annexures P-4 and P-5) by the respondent, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the matter is pending decision before the respondent for quite some long period. Even his applications (Annexures P-4 and P-5) are pending undecided. He further submits that petitioner will be satisfied in case respondent is directed to consider and decide the application (Annexure P-5) filed by the petitioner within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, Claims Commissioner, Revenue and Rehabilitation Department, Punjab-respondent is directed to look into the matter, consider the grievance of the petitioner raised vide his application (Annexure P-5), which seems to be genuine and decide the same at an early date and preferably on 01.08.2016 when the matter is already stated to be listed,

by passing an appropriate order thereon but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition stands disposed of.
