Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the parties are ad idem that let the present writ petition be disposed of, by issuing appropriate directions to Deputy Commissioner, Bathinda-respondent No.4 to consider and decide the pending legal notice dated 01.07.2015 (Annexure P-3) at an early date.

In view of the above common stand taken by learned counsel for the parties, present writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to Deputy Commissioner, Bathinda-respondent No.4 to consider the grievance raised by the petitioner vide legal notice dated 01.07.2015 (Annexure P-3), keeping in

view the observations made by a Division Bench of this Court in its order dated 04.10.2008 passed in CWP No.18143 of 2006 (Manjinder Singh Vs. State of Punjab and others) (Annexure P-7) and pass an appropriate order thereon at an early date, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

Disposed of, accordingly.
