In the instant petition, the petitioner has sought for direction to the respondents to appoint the petitioner on compassionate ground on account of the death of the father of the petitioner on 25.2.2005.

The father of the petitioner Shri Bhola Ram, who was working as a Mazdoor, died on 25.2.2005 while in service. He was survived by Smt. Kanta Devi, Shri Parveen Kumar, Shri Ashwani Kumar, Shri Rakesh Kumar and the petitioner. Shri Parveen Kumar submitted an application for consideration of his name for appointment on compassionate ground. The same was considered by the respondents. While assessing the merits of the case with reference to the instructions of the Government of India, his claim has been declined. Thereafter, the present petitioner is stated to have submitted an application for compassionate appointment.

Once the respondents have considered the claim of the family member of the deceased Shri Bhola Ram, question of considering the name of other member may not arise after lapse of number of years. Further, it is evident that the petitioner has not submitted his application for compassionate appointment. What has been relied on is only with reference

to the application submitted by the petitioner's mother on 10.4.2013.

Therefore, the petitioner has not made out a case so as to seek writ of mandamus directing the respondents to consider his name for appointment on compassionate ground.

Accordingly, the present petition is dismissed.
