This order will dispose of three writ petitions bearing CWP Nos.13779, 14322 and 15053 of 2016, as the issue involved in all the writ petitions is common.

Reply to the petition(s) filed by the respondents today in Court is taken on record.

The prayer in these petition(s) is for issuance of directions to the respondents not to dispossess the petitioner(s), who are carrying on different types of business as envisaged under the Street Vendors (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street Vending) Act, 2014 (for short "the Act").

Learned counsel for the respondents submitted that office order has been issued on 13.05.2016 that all the existing street vendors should not be removed, evicted or relocated in terms of Section 3 (3) of the Act until the survey is completed and the Registration Certificate is issued by the Town Vending Committee. She further submitted that Town Vending Committee has already been constituted and even the agency to carry out the survey has also been appointed.

Learned counsel for the petitioner(s) submitted that in view of the fair stand taken by learned counsel for the respondents and the order passed by the Commissioner, Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh, the prayer made in the above said three writ petitions has been rendered infructuous and the same may be disposed of as such.

Ordered accordingly.
