RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (ORAL)

Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that when the matter was pending consideration before respondent No.2, petitioner received a communication dated 11.04.2016 (Annexure P-5), which was replied by the petitioner vide his letter dated 05.05.2016 (Annexure P-6) but it has not been decided so far by respondent No.2. He further submits that petitioner will be satisfied in case respondent No.2 is directed to consider the grievance of the petitioner and take the matter to its logical end, by passing an appropriate order on the communications (Annexures P-5 and P-6).

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner at some length and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, Regional Passport Officer, Amritsar-respondent No.2 is directed to look into the matter, consider the grievance

raised by the petitioner recorded in the communication dated 11.04.2016 (Annexure P-5) and the reply thereto vide Annexure P-6 and pass an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition stands disposed of.
