Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that when the genuine grievance of the petitioner was not being redressed, it finally approached the respondent authorities, by way of representation dated 20.6.2016 (Annexure P-7), but the same is also pending decision. He further submits that the petitioner will be satisfied in case respondent No.4 is directed to consider and decide its representation, within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, the present writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the Deputy Commissioner, Roopnagar-respondent No.4, to look into the matter, consider the grievance of the petitioner raised vide its representation dated 20.6.2016 (Annexure P-7) and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of three weeks from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order. Respondent No.4 shall also be at liberty to pass an appropriate order for making an interim arrangement in the larger interest of residents of the village.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
