DAYA CHAUDHARY, J.

In response to notice of motion, short reply has been filed by learned State counsel in Court today and the same is taken on record.

Learned counsel for respondent-State submits that in view of the stand taken in the written statement that the petitioner has been appointed, the present petition has become infructuous, whereas, learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is also entitled for consequential benefits including promotion.

In view of stand taken in the written statement, the present petition is disposed of.

However, the petitioner is at liberty to make fresh representation regarding the consequential benefits for which he is entitled.

In case any such representation is made within a period of one month, the respondents are directed to consider and decide the same within a period of two months thereafter and if the petitioner is found to be entitled for the relief sought in the representation, the same be granted to him within a period of two months thereafter.

In case the petitioner is still aggrieved in any manner, he is at liberty to avail appropriate remedy.
