Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner places reliance on two orders passed by this Court. One order was passed on 31.10.2013 (Annexure P-9) in CWP No.24067 of 2013 (Indian Oil Corporation Limited Vs. State of Punjab and others) and another order was passed on 25.3.2014 (Annexure P-10) in CWP No.5668 of 2014 (Indian Oil Corporation Limited Vs. State of Punjab and others). He further submits that the petitioner will be satisfied in case the present writ petition is disposed of, in terms of the above-said orders passed by this Court.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the instant writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to the appellate authority to decide the appeal, stated to be pending before it for the last about seven months, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

It is further directed that if the eviction order is sustained by the appellate authority, Senior Superintendent of Police, SBS Nagar-respondent No.2, shall provide police assistance to the petitioner to ensure taking peaceful possession of the demised property.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
