The petitioner challenges order dated 16.7.2014 (Annexure P-13) whereby the petitioner's case for employment due to acquisition of land measuring 35 Marla belonging to him has been rejected on the ground that it is below 4 Kanals as per the policy.

It is the case of the petitioner that his real paternal uncle's land measuring 6K was also acquired and, therefore, the total land of the family, thus, acquired was 7K-15M. Reference is also made to the affidavit given by his uncle Jagar Singh (Annexure P-10). The affidavit had been submitted to the effect that he wanted a job to be provided to the petitioner since he had no real child and he was residing with his nephew, i.e., the petitioner and was being taken care by him. This aspect has obviously not been even touched by the authorities and, therefore, order dated 16.7.2014 cannot be sustained. The policy being benevolent, it would be open to the respondent-

Deputy Commissioner to get the matter examined whether the petitioner and

his uncle are residing in a joint family and whether there is any substance in the affidavit submitted by Jagar Singh.

Resultantly, this petition is disposed of and a direction is issued to the respondents to decide afresh the case of the petitioner after making appropriate inquiry whether the petitioner would fall within the cases of exceptional hardship of land measuring between 4K to 2 acres keeping in view the above observations. The needful be done within 6 months.
