This order shall dispose of bunch of writ petitions bearing  
CWP Nos. 18576, 22855, 25592 of 2014, 14373, 25783 of 2015, and  
1042,4490, 4730 and 4500 of 2016

The prayer in these writ petitions is for issuance of  
directions to the respondents not to dispossess the petitioners, who  
are carrying on different types of business as envisaged under the  
Street Vendors (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street  
Vending) Act, 2014 (for short, the Act).

Learned counsel for the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh submitted that office order has been issued on 13.05.2016 that all the existing street vendors should not be removed, evicted or relocated in terms of Section 3(3) of the Act until the survey is completed and the Registration Certificate is issued by the Town Vending Committee. She further submitted that Town Vending Committee has already been constituted and even the agency to carry out the survey has also been appointed.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that in view of the fair stand taken by learned counsel for the Corporation and the order passed by the Commissioner, Municipal Corporation Chandigarh, the prayer made in the present writ petitions has been rendered infructuous and the same may be disposed of as such.

Ordered accordingly.
