Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioners have approached this Court, by way of instant writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of Mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that when the genuine grievance of the petitioners was not being redressed, they finally approached respondent No.2 by way of self contained representation dated 20.5.2016 (Annexure P-5), but the same is also pending decision. He further submits that the petitioners will be satisfied in case the DGM (LPG) Indian Oil Corporation Limited-respondent No. 2 is directed to consider and decide their representation, within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the DGM (LPG) Indian Oil Corporation Limited-respondent No. 2 is directed to look into the matter, consider the grievance of the petitioners, raised vide their representation dated 20.5.2016 (Annexure P-5) and decide the same, at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present petition stands disposed of.
