Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that when the genuine grievance of the petitioner was not being redressed, he finally approached the respondent authorities by way of representation/complaint dated 01.07.2016 (Annexure P-7) but the same is also pending decision. He further submits that petitioner will be satisfied in case respondent No.2 is directed to consider and decide the representation/complaint of the petitioner within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, Commissioner (Sales)-cum-Deputy Commissioner, Ambala-respondent No.2 is directed to look into the

matter, consider the grievance raised by the petitioner vide his representation/complaint dated 01.07.2016 (Annexure P-7), keeping in view the recommendations made in favour of the petitioner by the Tehsildar as well as vide his communication dated 29.02.2016 (Annexure P-5) and decide the same at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition stands disposed of.
