RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (ORAL)

Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of certiorari/mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the very outset, submits that for the time being, he restricts his prayer only qua a writ in the nature of mandamus. He further submits that when the genuine grievance of the petitioner was not being redressed, he finally approached the respondent authorities by way of self-contained representation dated 27.05.2016 (Annexure P-7) but the same is also pending decision. He also submits that petitioner will be satisfied in case respondent No.2 is directed to consider and decide the representation of the petitioner within a reasonable time by passing an appropriate order thereon.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, Engineer-in-Chief, PWD Public Health Engineering Department, Sector-4, Panchkula-respondent No.2 is directed to look into the matter, consider the grievance raised by the petitioner vide his representation dated 27.05.2016 (Annexure P-7) and decide the same at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

It goes without saying that claim of the petitioner for regularization of his service shall be considered, strictly in accordance with the relevant instructions issued by the State Government and if he is found entitled for regularization, then appropriate order shall be passed, strictly in accordance with law.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition stands disposed of.
