Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of instant writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of Certiorari/Mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the very outset, submits that for the time being, he restricts his prayer only qua the writ of Mandamus. He submits that when the genuine grievance of the petitioner was not being redressed by the respondent authorities, he finally approached respondent No.1 by way of legal notice dated 25.7.2016 (Annexure P-4), but the same is also pending decision. He further submits that the petitioner will be satisfied in case the General Manager, Food Corporation of India-respondent No.1 is directed to consider and decide his legal notice, within a reasonable time.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present petition stands disposed of.
