Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the very outset, fairly states that in view of the undisputed fact that 100% financial liability of the petitioner stands discharged by his depositing the total amount, in compliance of the assessment order and electric connection was also restored, the criminal liability, if any, would also stand compounded. He further submits that in view of his abovesaid statement, nothing is left to be decided in the present writ petition at the hands of this Court and the same may be disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous.
