Learned counsel for the State, at the very outset, rightly submits that since the licence issued to the petitioner, was for a particular year i.e. 2013-2014 and his appeal was also dismissed, nothing would survive in the present writ petition and the same may be disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous.

Abovesaid statement made by learned counsel for the State has not been controverted by learned counsel for the petitioner and rightly so, it being matter of record, which shows that nothing is survived in the present writ petition.

In view of the above, instant writ petition is disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous. However, since learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he is not having latest instructions in the matter, on his request, liberty is granted to get the present writ petition revived within a period of three months, if necessity arises.
