Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of instant writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of Mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner has filed his statutory petition under Section 27 of the Haryana Cooperative Societies Act, 1984, vide Annexure P-8, before respondent No.1 as far back as on 29.1.2015. Thereafter, as many as eight dates of hearing have been given but the matter has not been heard, nor any notice has been issued to the other side so far. He further submits that the only limited prayer of the petitioner, at this stage, is that respondent No.1 may be directed to hear the matter at an early date and decide the same within a reasonable time.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the Secretary to Government of Haryana, Department of Cooperation-respondent No.1, is directed to look into the matter, consider the petition filed by the petitioner under Section 27 of the Haryana Cooperative Societies Act, 1984 and decide the same at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of six months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present writ petition stands disposed of.
