Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of instant writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of Mandamus.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that instead of issuing notice of motion, let this writ petition be disposed of issuing appropriate directions. He further submits that petitioners will be satisfied in case respondent No. 5 is directed to consider and decide their representation dated 25.5.2015 (Annexure P-5), within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the Deputy Commissioner, District Bhiwani-respondent No.5 is directed to look into the matter, consider the grievance of the petitioners, raised vide their representation dated 25.5.2015 (Annexure P-5) and decide the same, at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present petition stands disposed of.
