RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (ORAL)

Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the very outset, fairly states that although the petitioner is seeking only a writ in the nature of mandamus, yet she did not approach the competent authority by moving an appropriate representation before filing the present writ petition. He further submits that given an opportunity, petitioner shall approach Registrar of Marriages (Under Hindu Marriage Act), Mohali-respondent No.2 by moving an appropriate representation within a period of two weeks from today and he may be directed to consider and decide the same, at an early date.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, instant writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to

Registrar of Marriages (Under Hindu Marriage Act), Mohali-respondent No.2 that if the petitioner approaches him by moving an appropriate representation within a period of two weeks from today, he shall consider and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of representation from the petitioner.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present writ petition stands disposed of.
