Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that when the genuine grievance of the petitioner was not being redressed, it finally approached the respondent authorities by way of legal notice dated 27.08.2016 (Annexure P-4) but the same is also pending decision. He further submits that petitioner will be satisfied in case respondent No.3 is directed to consider and decide the legal notice of the petitioner within a reasonable time by passing an appropriate order thereon.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, Senior Superintendent of Police, Bathinda-respondent No.3 is directed to look into the matter, consider the

grievance raised by the petitioner vide legal notice dated 27.08.2016 (Annexure P-4), keeping in view the order dated 04.10.2008 passed a Division Bench of this Court in CWP No.18143 of 2006 (Manjinder Singh Vs. State of Punjab and others) (Annexure P-5) and decide the same at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of three weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition stands disposed of.
