Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioners have approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of certiorari/mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that he does not intend to press this petition qua the order dated 9.8.2016 (Annexure P-7), for the time being. However, he submits that since electric supply of the petitioners is being repeatedly disconnected without any justified reasons, respondent No.5 may be directed to consider the grievances of the petitioners, which shall be raised by them within a period of two weeks by moving an appropriate representation.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the present writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to Secretary, Uttar Haryana Bijli Vitran Nigam-respondent No.5, that if the petitioners approach him by moving an appropriate representation within a period of two weeks from today, he shall consider their grievances and decide the same by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of representation from the petitioners.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
