Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of certiorari/mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he does not intend to press this writ petition for the writ in the nature of certiorari, for the time being. However, he submits that petitioner will be satisfied in case respondent No.2 is directed to consider and decide its representation dated 6.9.2016 (Annexure P-5) within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the present writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to Director, Rural Development and Panchayat, Punjab-respondent No.2, to look into the matter, consider the grievance of the petitioner raised vide its representation dated 6.9.2016 (Annexure P-5) and decide the same by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
