Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Notice of motion was issued. However, no reply has been filed on behalf of any of the respondents.

Learned counsel for the petitioner places reliance on an order dated 24.9.2015 (Annexure P-10) passed by this Court in CWP No.15341 of 2012 (Mohan Lal Arora Vs. Registrar, Cooperative Societies, Haryana and others), to contend that the present writ petition is squarely covered by this order.

In view of the above-said undisputed fact situation obtaining on the record of the present case, instant writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to the Administrator of respondent-Cooperative Society and in the absence of any such Administrator, to the Assistant Registrar, Cooperative Societies, Gurgaon-respondent No.3, to look into the matter, consider the

grievance of the petitioner and take a final decision at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
