Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he has got the clear instructions to say that petitioner moved an appropriate representation before respondent No.2 on 14.09.2016, but no action thereon was taken. He further submits that given an opportunity, petitioner shall approach to the competent authority by moving an appropriate representation within a period of three days from today and

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Chief Medical Officer, Civil Hospital, Moga, may be directed to consider and decide the same, at an early date.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the Chief Medical Officer, Civil Hospital, Moga-respondent No.2, is directed that if the petitioner approaches him by moving an appropriate representation within a period of three days from today as undertaken on behalf of the petitioner, he shall consider and decide the same at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of representation from the petitioner.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, the present petition stands disposed of.
