Learned counsel for the petitioners, at the very outset, fairly states that he does not intend to press this writ petition qua the writ of Certiorari, for the time being, because the Will in question is already under challenge before the learned civil court, at the instance of the petitioners. However, learned counsel for the petitioners seeks liberty to the petitioners to move an appropriate application in their pending civil suit, as and when necessity arises and it may also be observed that civil court decree shall be binding between the parties and mutation shall be entered and sanctioned accordingly.

In view of the abovesaid statement made by learned counsel for the petitioners, which has been found genuine and worth acceptance, present

writ petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioners as prayed for. It also goes without saying that the civil court decree shall prevail upon the parties and the same shall be binding on the revenue authorities as well. As and when the civil court decree is passed, petitioners shall be at liberty to bring the factum of passing of the civil court decree to the notice of competent revenue authorities, seeking sanctioning of mutation on the basis of said civil court decree.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present writ petition stands disposed of.
