Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioners have approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that when the genuine grievance of the petitioners was not being redressed, they finally approached the respondent authorities by way of Resolution dated 26.09.2016 (Annexure P-4) but the same is also pending decision. He further submits that petitioners will be satisfied in case respondent No.3 is directed to consider and decide the resolution of the petitioners within a reasonable time by passing an appropriate order thereon.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, Block Development and Panchayat Officer, Patiala-respondent No.3 is directed to look into the matter,

consider the grievance raised by the petitioners vide resolution dated 26.09.2016 (Annexure P-4) and decide the same keeping in view the directions issued by this Court vide its order dated 30.01.2015 passed in CWP No.25488 of 2014 (Baljinder Kaur Vs. Director, Panchayats, Punjab and others), at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition stands disposed of.
