Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioners have approached this Court by way of present writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, for seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioners, after arguing the case for some time and realizing that petitioners are having appropriate remedy under the relevant provisions of Punjab Land Revenue Act, which has not been availed by them before filing the present writ petition, seeks permission of the Court to withdraw the present writ petition with liberty to the petitioners to approach the competent authority, by moving an appropriate application, at the first instance.

Permission is granted.

Dismissed as withdrawn with liberty, as prayed for.

However, it is made clear that if the petitioners approach the competent authority by moving an appropriate application seeking demarcation

of their land, the competent authority shall consider the grievance raised by the petitioners and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, but in any case within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of application from the petitioners.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present writ petition stands disposed of.
