Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, the petitioners have approached this Court, by way of instant writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of Mandamus.

It is a matter of record that two identical matters bearing CRM-M-19944 of 2016 (Kulwinder Singh and another Vs. State of Punjab and another) and CRM-M-21901 of 2016 (Jasvir Singh and another Vs. State of Punjab and others), seeking exactly the same relief, are already pending before this Court. This Court has already issued notice of motion in both the abovesaid criminal miscellaneous petitions, thus, seized of the matter. In both the cases, status reports have also been called for and the respondent-CBI has already filed its reply in one of the cases.
