Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, the petitioner has approached this Court, by way of instant writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of Certiorari/Mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the very outset, fairly states that he does not intend to press this petition qua the writ of Certiorari for the time being. He further submits that petitioner may be permitted to file its reply to the impugned communications dated 26.8.2016 (Annexure P-16) as

well as dated 6.9.2016 (Annexure P-17), alongwith relevant material available with the petitioner. He submits that petitioner shall file its self contained reply to the abovesaid notices within a period of two weeks from today and respondent No.3 may be directed to consider reply of the petitioner, grant an opportunity of being heard to the petitioner and thereafter may pass an appropriate order, in accordance with law. He also submits that till an appropriate order is passed by respondent No.3, consequent action pursuant to the abovesaid notices may be ordered to be kept in abeyance.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, instant writ petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to submit its reply to the abovesaid communications dated 26.8.2016 (Annexure P-16) as well as dated 6.9.2016 (Annexure P-17) to the Director, Shaheed Hasan Khan Mewati Government Medical College, Nalhar, District Mewat-respondent No.3 within a period of two weeks from today.

After receipt of reply from the petitioner, the Director, Shaheed Hasan Khan Mewati Government Medical College, Nalhar, District Mewat-respondent No.3 shall consider the grievance raised by the petitioner, grant an opportunity to being heard and shall pass an appropriate order thereon, at an early date, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of reply from the petitioner

However, keeping in view the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case and also to ensure that no serious prejudice is caused to either of the parties, it is further directed that till respondent No.3 shall pass an

appropriate order, any subsequent action pursuant to the impugned communications 26.8.2016 (Annexure P-16) and 6.9.2016 (Annexure P-17), shall remain in abeyance.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present writ petition stands disposed of.
