Applicant seeks permission to place on record legible (vernacular) copy of Annexure P-8, in compliance of the order dated 19.10.2016 passed by this Court.

Application is allowed, as prayed for.

CWP No.21585 of 2016

Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court, by way of present writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that when the genuine grievance of the petitioner was not being redressed, he finally approached the Chief Secretary, Punjab by way of self-contained complaint dated 07.09.2015

(Annexure P-11) but the same is also pending decision. He further submits that petitioner will be satisfied in case the Chief Secretary, Punjab is directed to consider and decide the complaint of the petitioner within a reasonable time by passing an appropriate order thereon.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, the Chief Secretary, Punjab is directed to look into the matter, consider the complaint dated 07.09.2015 (Annexure P-11) of the petitioner and decide the same at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition stands disposed of.
