RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (Oral)

After arguing the case for some time, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that she does not intend to press this writ petition on merits, at this stage. She further submits that let the instant writ petition be disposed of, with liberty to the petitioner to apply afresh and in case he moves an application within a period of one month from today, respondent authorities may be directed to consider the same without having been influenced by the earlier orders and decide the matter afresh in accordance with law.

After hearing the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, instant writ petition is disposed of, with liberty to the petitioner to move an appropriate application for grant of arms licence within a period of one month from today and the respondent authorities are directed to consider the said application of the petitioner without having been influenced by the earlier orders including Annexures P-1 and P-6 and decide the same at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of four months from the date of receipt of application from the petitioner.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, instant writ petition is disposed of.
