Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioner has approached this Court by way of instant writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ in the nature of mandamus.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the very outset, fairly states that though the petitioner is seeking only a writ in the nature of mandamus, but he did not move the latest and comprehensive representation to the competent authority, before filing the present writ petition. He further submits that given an opportunity, he himself shall serve respondent No.1 by way of a self-contained legal notice on behalf of the petitioner within a period of three weeks from today and respondent No.1 may be directed to look into the matter afresh and decide the legal notice of the petitioner at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the instant writ petition is disposed of, with a direction to the Financial Commissioner and Principal Secretary to

Government of Haryana, Department of Home, Haryana-respondent No.1 that if the petitioner approaches him by moving an appropriate and self-contained legal notice within a period of three weeks from today, as undertaken on his behalf, he shall consider and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law and also without having been influenced by the earlier proceedings and result thereof. Let an appropriate order be passed by respondent No.1 within a period of three months from the date of receipt of legal notice from the petitioner.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the instant writ petition stands disposed of.
